

“MOVE ON WHEN READY”

FACT SHEET

What is Move on When Ready (MOWR)? Move on When Ready provides opportunities for high school juniors and senior to attend a college, university or technical college **full-time** to earn both high school and college credit.

Student Eligibility:

- Upcoming (2010-2011) high school junior and/or senior
- Must be on-track for graduation
- Must be a legal resident of Georgia for one year
- Must have been a full-time student in a Georgia public school during the prior school year (2009-2010)
- Must meet all eligible post-secondary admissions/acceptance requirements

Costs:

- **Georgia Department of Education:** Tuition, fees and materials
- **Students and Parents/Guardians:** Books, food, lodging (where applicable), and transportation

Questions and Answers:

- 1. Are MOWR students required to take End of Course Tests (EOCTs) and the Georgia High School Graduation Tests (GHSGTs)?** YES
- 2. Can students participating in the MOWR program still participate in their high school of record’s extracurricular activities and sports?** YES, as long as their academic schedule can accommodate practices, games, etc.
- 3. Is part-time or full-time status required?** Full-time status is required for MOWR; all courses are taken on the college campus or online (if offered by college). Full-time status requires a minimum of 12 hours.
- 4. What courses are available?** Approved academic, career technical, fine arts, and elective courses
- 5. When are the course offered?** MOWR courses may be taken during the traditional public school day or beyond the regular school hours.
- 6. Will MOWR credit transfer out of state?** There are no guarantees or established with other states.
- 7. What happens if a student is unsuccessful in the MOWR program?** The student must immediately return to their high school of record. They lose all credits and get off track for graduation.
- 8. Is there a GPA requirement for students to participate?** The only GPA requirement is that which is required by the post-secondary institution. Students must be accepted into the college in order to participate in MOWR; this includes any post-secondary assessment scores as well (SAT, ACT, COMPASS, etc.)
